


## G.P.A. DEFINED

- Un-weighted or Cumulative GPA (All grades averaged together) based on a 4.0 scale.
- Weighted GPA (Honors, Dual Enrollment, and AP courses averaged together)

Bonus points- .025 for Honors \& .050 for DC/AP
GPA CAP! NEVV for class of 2024 and beyond 4.95 weighted

- Core GPA (Only CORE grades averaged together)
- Says NSHE Core GPA

## ADVANCED HONORS DIPLOMA

- A student must complete the following:

## ACT - TEST DAY March 7, 2023

- You have to take the ACT to graduate
- Remember, scores are sent to colleges by you
- You choose who to send them to... same with SAT.

■ Check your chosen college websites for testing requirements.

- ACT/SAT scores are NOT on your transcript!
- Make sure you create your ACT account WITH your ACT ID number which will be on your school test report ACT that you will get after the test.
- The ACT score will be used to qualify for the CCR diploma, and open periods.
- You need an 18 for English and 22 for math
- Can be used for Millennium Scholarship INSTEAD of GPA if you don't have a minimum of a 3.25 weighted
- Need a 21 composite on ACT

OR

- Need a 1070 combined math, reading and writing if you take SAT Take ACT Seriously - a lot depends on your score

WHAT DO I HAVE TO DO IN HIGH SCHOOL TO QUALIFY?
Students in Graduating Classes of 2017 \& later* will be eligible when all of the following conditions are met:


RESIDENCE
You must have been a resident of Nevada at least two of your High school years.


## GPA

You must finish high school with an overal 3.25 GPA for all coursework, or receive a qualified score on a college entrance examination.***

Finally, you must have completed the minimum core curriculum requirements:
HIGH SCHOOL COURSES UNITS English
Math (including Algebra II or higher) Science
Social Studies and History TOIMi

GPA
(weighted or unweighted) OR test score

## MAINTAIN ELIGIBILITY

To receive the benefits of the Nillennium Scholarship Program, you must enroll in an eligible institution of higher education in Nevada.

- It is important to remember receiving a Millennium Scholarship does not guarantee your admission to any institution.

After your admission to an eligible institution, you must meet the following equirements to receive and maintain the benefits of the scholarship: Enroll each semester in a minimum of 9 credits at a NSHE community college or 12 credits at any other eligible institutions.
You must enroll in a program of study leading to a recognized associate degree, baccalaureate degree, or pre-baccalaureate certificate.
You must maintain a 2.60 semester GPA for each semester until you complete a total of 30 credits. Starting in the semester in which you earn 30 or more credits, you must maintain a 2.75 GPA each semester you receive Millennium funds.

If you fail to meet the minimum requirements in any semester in which you receive funding, you will receive a strike and your scholarship will be suspended. Eligibility for the Millennium Scholarship can be regained only once by meeting all of the requirements listed above in a subsequent semester. Loss of eligibility a second time will permanently remove you from the program.
